Having a Drinkable Water Supply in Case of a Natural Disaster

There are many sorts of natural disasters that may affect numerous parts of the world. Some of the worst ones include hurricanes, tornadoes, and tremors. What if you were impacted by one of these disasters? Will you have the clean drinking water available that your family is going to need? In any kind of disaster, water fast becomes the most needed commodity, so it 's important for you to plan for the chance. Keep a fine supply of [clean drinking water](#) in your home, and look for different sources you might use if the public water system would become out of commission. The list below will help you make a plan to provide for your water wants.

Putting Together a List of [Sources of Clean Water](#)

If you hear about a upcoming emergency, right away take steps to stockpile as much clean drinking water as you can :

- * Fill containers with ice water and put them in your cooler and freezer. You will be able to melt the ice later to have the drinking water you want.
- * Purchase a good supply of bottled water and ice.
- * Use bleach to wash your tub, and then fill it with water.
- * Fill any large, clean receptacles that you have with water.

Finding Water Sources that are not so Plain

Have you ever thought about other places in your home where you 'll be able to find clean water? If not, now's the time to acquaint yourself with many of them, because sometime they could make a big difference in your family's contentment.

- * There's clean water in your toilet tank (not the water in the bowl). If you've kept the tank clean and not added chemical cleansing agents to it, the water will be perfectly safe to drink.
- * At any given time there is a quantity of water in your water pipes waiting to be run into your home. In an emergency scenario you can drain this water out to be used. Place a large container under the lowest-level tap in your home. Go up and switch on the highest faucet that will release the air pressure within the pipes allowing the water to flow into your container. For houses with only one story, simply drain each faucet.
- * You'll be ready to drain a large amount of water from your hot water heater. Shut off the power and permit the water to cool down. Open the drain valve at the bottom of the tank and permit the water to drain into a giant, clean container.

Since you could feel better if you sterilize some of the water you can retrieve from in the plumbing system in your home, you can always keep a supply of chemical purification tablets with your emergency supplies to be used if needed.

Outside Water Sources Which are Safe

It's possible that in an emergency situation you may not be able to use the water sources in your home at all . Therefore , you must know where you'll find clean water outside of your home. Some common sources that you may use include :

- * Water that's still in your garden hose.
- * Rain water which you've permitted to collect in a clean container or on a bit of plastic.
- * Melted snow.

Once more, you should take care that the water you get from these sources hasn't been contaminated. If the water is dubious, you either have to do something to purify it or avoid it all together.

Tenets for Careful Water usage

Take care when using water from outside water sources including streams, rivers, and lakes as well as other standing bodies of water. It may look clean, but you never can tell what sort of bacteria it would contain which could lead you to get terribly ill. In fact, there are contaminants in water that could even be fatal to you or a member of the family. If there's any query at all about the safety of the water, don't permit any one to drink it till it's been purified.

It 's important to understand the tricks for finding [clean drinking water](#) during times of disaster. Your understanding might finish up being the difference between life and death.
